## Steven Evans

Bio and CV

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Steven Evans knows how a moment on the dancefloor can echo down the years. In a career that has spanned more than three decades, Evans has consistently explored the connections between music, language, memory, identity, and collectivity.

Evans first arrived in New York City in the late 1980s and became involved in two scenes that fundamentally shaped his artistic practice: activism, as a member of activist groups like ACT UP, Queer Nation, and Visual AIDS, and dance music. Since this period, Evans' works have referenced pop, disco, and nightclub anthems blended with agitprop graphic strategies to create radiant works made from neon, vinyl, paint, and—for the first time in this new work—LEDs.

Steven Evans earned a BFA in photography at the Atlanta College of Art, and an MFA from the Nova Scotia College of Art and Design. Evans is an artist, writer, curator, and Executive Director of the award-winning arts organization FotoFest, which founded and sponsors the first and longest-

running international Biennial of Photography and New Media Art in the US. Evans has served as a panelist for the NEA, NY State Council on the Arts, and the Texas Commission on the Arts. Evans worked with a wide range of artists and collaborators as Managing Director of the Dia:Beacon Museumin NY and as Director of the Linda Pace Foundation in San Antonio, TX.

He has participated in solo and group exhibitions in Houston, NY, LA, Tokyo, Paris, Berlin. Exhibitions of note include, *If I Can't Dance, It's Not My Revolution*, his first solo museum exhibition, at Contemporary Arts Museum, Houston; *Macho Man, Tell It To My Heart* at Artists Space, New York, and *Powerful Babies, Keith Haring's Impact on Artists Today* at Spritmuseum, Stockholm.

In 2022, Steven Evans was commissioned by the NYC AIDS Memorial to create a site-specific, sculptural installation of 12 text-based, polychromatic, LED sculptures titled, Songs for a Memorial (2020-22).
